

LANGLEY SCHOOL UNIFORM

- **Black School Blazer with School Badge**
- **Mid-Grey Woollen Long Sleeved, V-necked jumper or cardigan**
- **House Tie or colours tie if awarded**
- **House Scarf (optional) No other scarf may be worn**

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING: Items marked with * **MUST** be obtained from the Official Outfitters – Birds of Dereham

Girls

- Langley - Mid Grey knee length skirt*
- Long-sleeved White Blouses* (may be short sleeved for the Summer Term) Black Tights or Grey Socks (may be grey or flesh coloured tights, or white ankle or knee-length socks for the Summer Term)

Boys

- Dark Grey Trousers*
- White Shirt (may be short sleeved for the Summer Term)*
- Plain Grey Socks
- Plain black belt with small buckle (optional)

No dark or patterned T-Shirts or vests to be worn under shirts – plain, white only (optional.)

Shoes

Formal Plain **black flat heeled shoes only**. These must be 'polishable' – therefore no suede or canvas or similar allowed.

Top Coat

Any smart black coat.

Gloves (optional)

Plain black. No other gloves to be worn.

Where any item of clothing is not identified as either boy or girl please assume it is required for both.

Sixth Form Students Only

Students are required to wear a dark coloured smart business-style suit; skirts/trousers/dress and jacket must be of the same material. Trousers must not be leggings, cropped or skinny in style please. Skirts should be knee length.

They may wear a white or pastel coloured shirt/blouse. Please note that shirts and blouses should not be highly patterned or strongly coloured. Blouses do not include vests, camisoles or low cut blouses, which are inappropriate for school.



A dark V-necked/formal round neck plain jumper can also be worn; they should not be a sweatshirt or high necked. Boys are also required to wear a professional personal tie of their choice. Socks should be plain and dark in colour.

A Classic style dark full or knee length wool style coat without embellishments or as an alternative a black outdoor jacket not 'puffer jacket style' please. House scarves or plain dark scarves only please.

Sixth Form students who are not involved in squads that represent the school for team sports will be expected to purchase only the minimum requirement of kit**. This must be worn during compulsory games lessons. Non-school items that may be appropriate (e.g. lycra garments) must be plain black.

Uniform matters

As the title says – uniform does matter! We act how we dress. School uniform is our “business dress” and should be worn smartly i.e. shirts tucked in, top button done up and ties tight. Slovenly worn uniform creates a slovenly outlook to work. Please do not accept the comment that “nobody wears correct uniform” or that “teachers don’t bother”. Staff are under instruction not to allow students into class unless they are properly attired.

Marking of clothing and equipment

Every item must be marked with the student’s name, otherwise lost property cannot be identified. This is particularly important for boarders whose laundry is done on the school premises. The school cannot accept responsibility for unmarked articles.

Lost property

Each term a large amount of lost property goes unclaimed. Please encourage your child to check first of all with the Form Tutors (general uniform) and PE Staff (for games uniform). In the event of any personal possessions being left at the school by a student, the school reserves the right to dispose of such personal possessions whatever their value, without making compensation. The personal possessions are not collected by the student concerned or by someone on his/her behalf by the end of the first week of the next term, the school accepts no liability in respect of any such personal possessions.

Jewellery

For reasons of security and safety, the wearing of jewellery is discouraged. However, the following regulations apply:

- If ears are pierced, one pair of plain stud earrings to be worn, with one in each ear. No other body piercing is allowed. Earrings must be removed for PE lessons.
- Not more than one discreet ring may be worn.
- No bracelets, wristlets or bangles to be worn on wrists or ankles. A watch may be worn.
- One plain simple necklace may be worn under the shirt, but must be removed for P.E. and Games.
- Only official school badges to be worn.

Hair

Legislating on hair styles is fraught with difficulties but ostentatious styles which draw attention to the student are unacceptable.

Hair that is too short (less than no. 3) or dyed an unnatural colour is not permitted. Styles should not include shaved lines, patterns or “steps”. Neat and tidy facial hair is only permitted in the Sixth Form.

Pupils in all year groups are allowed to have their hair down. In practical subjects where there may be a Health and Safety issue, pupils must have their hair tied back if worn long, or use grips/clips to keep all hair off the face. This includes subjects such as P.E, D&T, the Sciences and Food Preparation & Nutrition.
